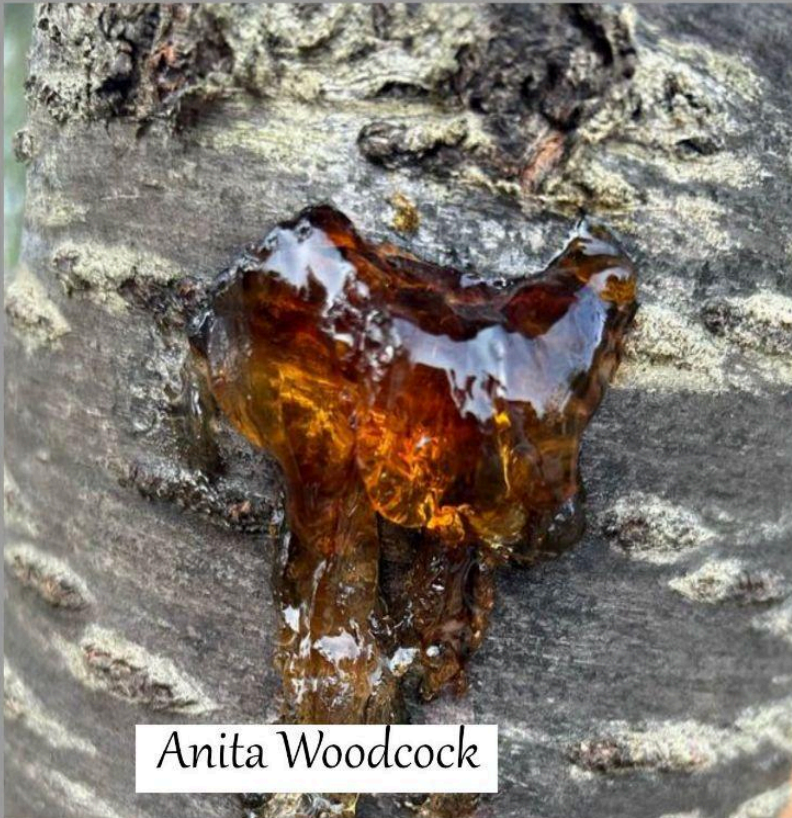


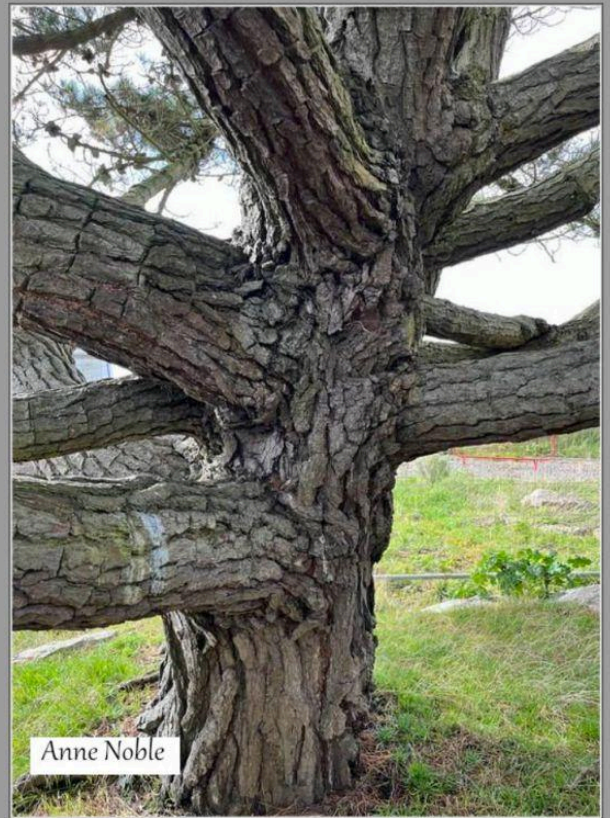
## Newsletter November 2024

Our theme for October was "Bark" and our Facebook page was inundated with examples from those of you who like skulking around in the woods. We start with Bernadette's collage:

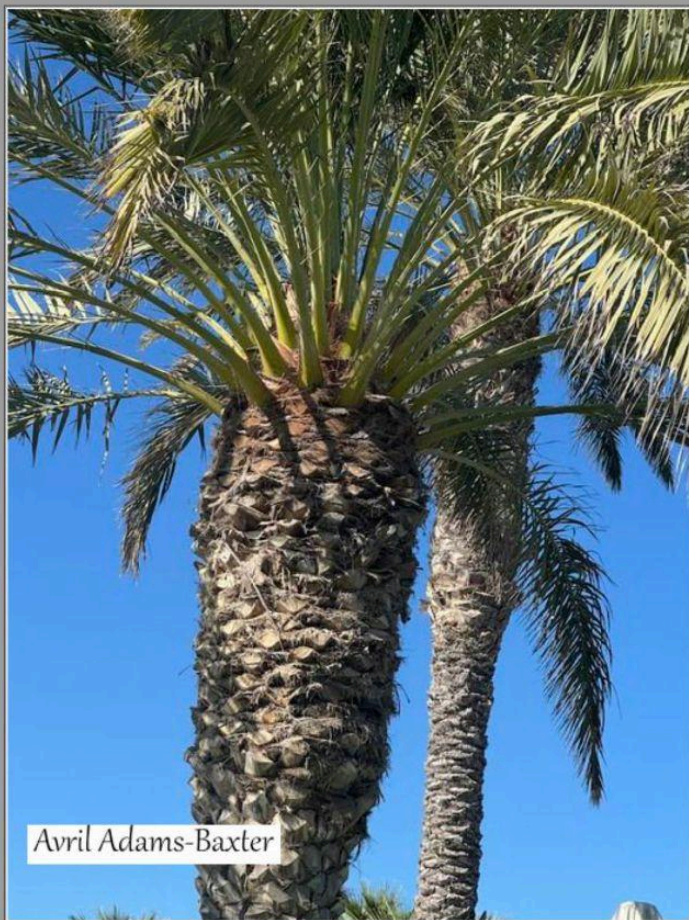




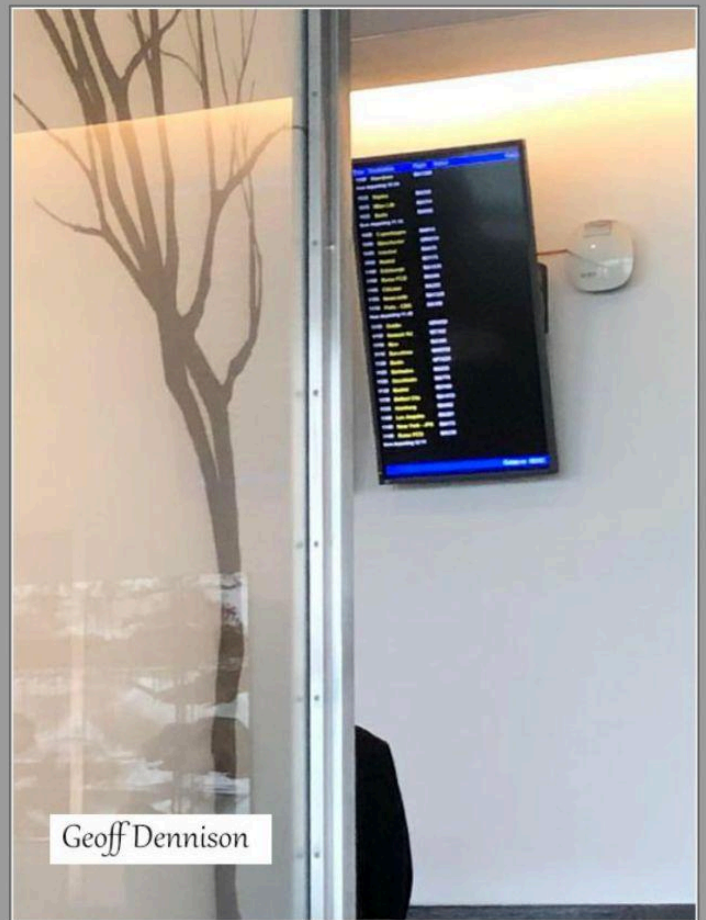

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 14th November at the village of Stedham, West Sussex. I have checked it out today and if we get some decent weather there should be some glorious Autumn colours. As we are now on GMT with poor light in the afternoons (until sunset) I am suggesting that we meet a bit earlier ie 11.00am. We could then finish with lunch between 1.00 and 1.30pm.

Instructions on how to get to the meeting point will follow below. You are free to roam wherever you can in the village but I do recommend Stedham Mill on the River Rother. I will lead a short circular walk (about 1 mile) which will include this. It could be muddy in places so reasonably tough shoes should be worn. It is also possible to get to the Mill on a hard surface.



Parking at Stedham Village Green

To get to Stedham, take the A272 road from Petersfield towards Midhurst. Once you have passed the village of Trotton (where there is a bridge controlled by traffic lights) look for signs to Stedham on the left. If possible take the SECOND road in as this will lead you directly to the village green where you should be able to find a parking space. If you take the first road in then follow it until you come to a junction where you should turn left. We will meet at the green at 11.00am.

If you would like to meet up later for lunch and/or a drink I would suggest The Tea Barn at Durleighmarsh Farm. This is on the right as you travel back along the A272 towards Petersfield, about 1.5 miles after Rogate.

It is possible to reserve places here, so if you would like to call in, please confirm and I'll let them know the day before. Obviously a lot depends on the weather but I'll confirm everything at the beginning of that week.
